## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the State of Texas 2 has the responsibility and authority under Chapter 665, Government Code, as authorized by Section 7, Article XV, Texas Constitution, 3 to present articles of impeachment to the Texas Senate calling for 4 5 the removal from office of a member, regent, trustee, commissioner having control or management of a state institution or 6 7 enterprise for misconduct, malfeasance, abuse of office, incompetency; and 8 WHEREAS, The Texas Supreme Court in Ferguson v. Maddox, 263 9 S.W. 888 (Tex. 1924), established that impeachable offenses need 10 not be violations of the law, finding that "'[t]he purposes of an 11 12 impeachment lie wholly beyond the penalties of the statute or the customary law.' The Constitution, in relation to impeachment, has 13 14 in mind the protection of the people from official delinquencies or malfeasances"; and 15 WHEREAS, Wallace L. Hall Jr., a member of the Board of 16 Regents of The University of Texas System, may have obtained that 17 office through misrepresentation of material facts regarding his 18 experience and qualifications in a manner that violates the penal 19 laws of this state, including Section 37.10, Penal Code, and casts 20 21 doubt on his fitness to hold public office and ability to carry out the responsibilities of that office with the integrity expected of 22 23 a person holding a position of public trust in this state; and

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WHEREAS, Mr. Hall, through ongoing concealment of that

- 1 misrepresentation, may have continued to violate the public trust
- 2 and demonstrate continuing unfitness to hold office throughout his
- 3 service on the board of regents; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Hall, while holding office as a member of the
- 5 Board of Regents of The University of Texas System, may have abused
- 6 that office by making numerous unreasonably burdensome, wasteful,
- 7 and intrusive requests for information of certain University of
- 8 Texas System institutions as a member of the board of regents as
- 9 well as on his own behalf; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Hall has exhibited behavior that calls into
- 11 question his fitness for office by giving the incorrect and
- 12 misleading impression to certain institutions and personnel of The
- 13 University of Texas System that certain actions taken and requests
- 14 for information made by him were approved by the board of regents,
- 15 when in fact the actions taken or requests made were without
- 16 approval of the board of regents; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Hall may have violated the duties and
- 18 responsibilities of his office and interfered with the proper
- 19 functioning of The University of Texas System and its component
- 20 institutions by disregarding the processes and procedures of the
- 21 board of regents concerning the gathering and handling of
- 22 information from institutions of the system; now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 83rd Texas
- 24 Legislature initiate impeachment proceedings under Chapter 665,
- 25 Government Code, including the investigation of matters related to
- 26 a contemplated impeachment, against Wallace L. Hall Jr., a member
- 27 of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System, and any

- 1 other state officer that the investigation of the matters described
- 2 by this resolution reveals may have engaged in misconduct,
- 3 malfeasance, abuse of office, or incompetency; and, be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the house of representatives adopt the
- 5 following procedures for investigating the matters described by
- 6 this resolution and, if appropriate, preparing appropriate
- 7 articles of impeachment and acting on those articles of
- 8 impeachment:
- 9 SECTION 1. SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON IMPEACHMENT. The speaker
- 10 of the house of representatives shall appoint the House Special
- 11 Committee on Impeachment composed of seven members of the house of
- 12 representatives appointed by the speaker. The speaker shall
- 13 designate a committee member to serve as chair of the committee and
- 14 a committee member to serve as vice chair of the committee.
- 15 SECTION 2. INVESTIGATION; ARTICLES OF IMPEACHMENT. The
- 16 committee shall conduct a full and fair investigation under Chapter
- 17 665, Government Code, of the matters described by this resolution
- 18 and, if warranted, propose appropriate articles of impeachment
- 19 against Wallace L. Hall Jr., a member of the Board of Regents of The
- 20 University of Texas System, and any other state officer that the
- 21 investigation of the matters described by this resolution reveals
- 22 may have engaged in misconduct, malfeasance, abuse of office, or
- 23 incompetency, and present those articles to the Texas House of
- 24 Representatives to consider for presentment to the Texas Senate.
- 25 SECTION 3. POWERS; ADMINISTRATION. (a) The committee
- 26 shall meet at the call of the chair and may meet in executive
- 27 session if approved by a majority of the members of the committee.

- 1 (b) The committee has all the powers granted to a standing 2 committee under the Rules of the House of Representatives and under 3 Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government Code, including the power to 4 issue process to procure testimony or other evidence, and any powers provided to a legislative committee by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, or Chapter 665, Government Code, or other law. The committee is a general investigating committee of the house for purposes of 8 Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government Code.
- 9 (c) On the request of the committee, the Texas House of 10 Representatives or the Texas Legislative Council shall provide the 11 staff necessary to assist the committee in carrying out its duties.
- 12 (d) The operating expenses of the committee shall be paid as 13 determined by the Committee on House Administration.

- 1 Adopting procedures regarding the impeachment of Wallace L. Hall
- 2 Jr., a member of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas
- 3 System, or other state officers, for certain misconduct.
