## How the margins changed in the state's biggest counties

The number of votes separating the Republicans from the Democrats in the presidential contests in 2004 and 2008, and the percentage differences between the winners (Bush and McCain) and the losers (Kerry and Obama). Red numbers indicate Republican advantages; blue numbers favor the Democrats. And the change in the last column is the difference between the vote margins in the two years. The top 25 counties are ranked by the number of registered voters in 2008.
