

- "Chris Christie Winner Barack Obama: A personally liked president who has proven he will say anything necessary to suceed, ie; you can keep your current doctor and your cast of health care will not increase, in fact it will go down."
- "I think Mitch Daniel would be the stronger candidate against President Obama; however, I believe Sarah Palin will win the Republican primary because she is the godmother of the Tea Party and more conservative voters (activists) participate in primaries.
