Dear Mr. Maxwell,

Pursuant to Section 31.006 of the Texas Election Code, I respectfully request your assistance in reviewing allegations of criminal activity in Hill County elections. Please find the enclosed copy of an election complaint submitted by Mr. Philip Aaron Harris. The complaint alleges that multiple voters may have voted illegally under Texas Election Code Section 64.012. The results from the primary election in Hill County show that as many as 1743 more votes were cast than there were voters in the election.

After review of the submitted documentation, we believe the information regarding the offenses warrants a submission for criminal investigation to the Texas Attorney General. It appears from the documents that 6 or 7 voters voted more than once in the election and that one voter voted as many as four times. It may be that these discrepancies are the result of counting early voting and/or one or more election day precincts more than once, but it is impossible to tell without further investigation.

Hill County official election results can not be substantiated by the county election records. Specifically:

- -In the voter file, there are 6 or 7, depending upon how you read it, voters which have voted on two seperate dates. Once in early voting, once on election day. The county can not show that these voters did not in fact vote twice. They include: Rose Bell, Jana Buzbee, Cynthia Hudson, Jolynn Kasik, Benita Montgomery, and Louise Sulllins.
- According to the Hill County election file / Voter file Rose Bell shows to have voted 4 times. The County can not explain this.
- The official results in no way reflect the combination forms nor the voter file for the election. According to the published election results 9,038 votes were cast. The election voter file only lists 7,518 voters. A physical count of the signatures on the Combination Forms, adding in the Absentee ballots, only gives you 7,295 voters. The difference between the official results and the voter file is 1,520 voters or 16.82%. The difference between the official results and the Combination forms is 1,743 or 19.29% of the official results have NO VOTERS to account for said ballots.
- On July 19, 2016 the county staff presented the County Elections Commission and publically acknowledged that these figures are true and neither the county staff, nor the county's electronic voting equipment vendor- ES&S could find or explain the missing voters. They also have no idea on how to determin the origin of the votes. No plan of action was suggested on how to reconcile this discrepancy which they have already been investigating for three weeks.



VII. IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Pursuant to Section 31.006 of the Texas Election Code (the "Code"), the Office of the Secretary of State (the "Secretary of State") has the ability to refer elections complaints to the Office of the Attorney General (the "Attorney General"). If, after receiving a complaint alleging criminal conduct in connection with an election, the Secretary of State determines that there is reasonable cause to suspect that the alleged criminal conduct occurred, the Secretary of State shall promptly refer the complaint to the Attorney General. The Secretary of State shall deliver to the Attorney General all pertinent documents in the Secretary of State's possession.

Any person who believes that a criminal violation of the Code has occurred may file a complaint. In order to initiate the complaint process, a written and signed complaint must be filed with the Secretary of State. The complaint must allege the violation with particularity, identify the person(s) or entity responsible for the alleged violation, and contain a reference to the section of the Code alleged to have been criminally violated, if known.

The Secretary of State has no authority to order a new election, change an election result, or conduct a criminal investigation. This form is to be used solely to document alleged election irregularities and submit allegations of criminal violations of the Code to be referred to the Attorney General. Often complaints will be Code violations that do not amount to criminal violations or acts. These violations are election irregularities which may form the basis of an election contest, but do not carry a criminal penalty. These election irregularities will not be referred to the Attorney General for possible criminal prosecution.

Challenging an election result can be done either through (1) a recount or (2) an election contest. If you are seeking to alter the outcome of the election, you will need to use one of these methods of challenging the results, described below. A complaint filed with this form will not alter the results of an election.

Legal Remedies That May Alter the Election Outcome

1. Recount

Recounts are used only to recount the votes in a particular race (office) or measure. A recount does not have the scope or authority of an election contest in court, i.e., the recount committee will not look at the manner in which voters were qualified to vote in person or by mail or whether voters were eligible to vote in the election. The governing body of an entity cannot conduct a recount on its own motion, e.g., at the carryass.

Please note that recount request deadlines occur soon after the canvass - a recount must be requested not later than two days following the canvass. More information on filing recounts (including form, deposit information, and who and how to file) is available on the Secretary of State's website.

2. Election Contest

If a candidate disputes the outcome of the election, regardless of whether or not a recount has been conducted, and has discovered irregularities, fraud, or mistakes in the conduct of the election that affected or could have affected the outcome, he/she can file an election contest to challenge the election results. The legal question raised by an election contest is whether the outcome of the contested election, as shown by the final canvass, is not (or cannot be conclusively determined to be) the true outcome because (1) illegal votes were counted, or because (2) an election officer or other official administering the election either (i) prevented eligible voters from voting, (ii) failed to count legal votes, (iii) engaged in fraud or illegal conduct, or (iv) erred in some material way.

Contests involving county elections are filed in the district court in the relevant county. In most circumstances, the filing deadline for an election contest is 30 days after the canvass, except in the case of a primary or an election where a runoff is necessary, in which case the deadline for filing is 10 days after the final canvass. If a recount is held and the votes are changed, the date of the canvass of the recount (i.e., final canvass) becomes the new date by which the contest deadline is calculated.

Any losing candidate may contest an election. In a contest of an officer election, the contestant files suit against the election's winner (or in the event that the election outcome is determined by majority vote rather than plurality vote, the person or persons entitled to a place on the runoff ballot). Voters at large within a political subdivision do not possess standing to intervene as parties to an election contest for public office.

In an election contest, the court has the authority to: (1) examine ballots and equipment; (2) compel voters to reveal how they voted; (3) declare an election void if illegal votes are greater than or equal to the number of votes necessary to change the outcome or cannot ascertain the true outcome of the election; (4) order a new election (or new runoff election), if unable to ascertain true outcome; (5) subtract illegal votes, if able to determine the side for which an illegal vote was cast; or (6) declare outcome of election, if able to ascertain true outcome.

If you think either a recount or an election contest is the proper procedure for the remedy you seek, you may wish to consult private legal counsel regarding your legal options. The Secretary of State staff can provide general guidance on these procedures as well.

Dear Patsy Damschen,

On May 19, 2016 we submitted an Open Records Request for election information pertaining to the 2016 Republican Primary election. In the data provided from our original request there is some data which requires further clarification.

In the voter file, showing every voter which voted in the election, there are a 6 or 7 (depending upon how you read it) voters which have two ballot dates. Can you clarify how one has two dates for their ballot? They include: Rose Bell, Jana Buzbee, Cynthia Hudson, Jolynn Kasik, Benita Montgomery, and Louise Sullins. All these voters also show to have voted both in Early Voting as well as on Election Day. This is per the data you provided. They have ballot dates of 3/1/16 as well as 3/4/16. I know the response is this was simply human error. How can the public be assured that is the case?

Voter 1018644898, Rose Bell, shows up twice. This would indicate the person's vote was counted twice. Can you provide some clarification?

2,288 of the ballots were all accounted for on 3/4/16 – three days after the election. It seems odd that that many ballots would come in late At first glance it is obvious that that is the majority of the EV ballots, but it's is not inclusive of all of them. Can you please clarify why the data is displayed this way?

The most problematic issue with the data provided by the county is the result numbers in no way reflect the voter file. For example, Precinct 2 shows to have had 497 votes cast, including the 28 under votes; However the voter file only has 370 voters from Precinct 2. A delta of 127. Precinct 4 has a delta of 274 voters between the published results and the voter file. Overall, the county results vary from the voter file by 20.22% or 1,520 votes. Can you clarify how these can be off by so much?

I eagerly await your responses. Thank you for your help in this matter.
