Thank you for your invitation to participate in a debate to be hosted WFAA-TV, with live broadcasts to all Gannett stations statewide, as well as an online stream.

One of our primary goals for this campaign is to reach out and connect with voters across the state in ways never seen before in a gubernatorial race. From grassroots events to policy announcements and roundtable discussions, we have made our personal engagement with voters a focal point.

We believe this statewide debate would be a great opportunity to further our campaign's efforts to communicate Greg Abbott's message, and we greatly appreciate you extending this offer to us.
