On 2-9-2016 at approximately 1420 hours, I responded to the area of Walton Hall in reference to the report of racial

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slurs being said to a large group of Uplift Hampton Preparatory (UHP) students and staff. I met with the reporting party at Hullabaloo Hall. I identified the reporting party as is a teacher at Uplift Hampton Preparatory School located in Dallas, Texas. She was one of several teachers who were with a large (approximately 60-70) group of UHP students (approximately 15-17 years of age) who were taking a tour of Texas A&M University. reported the UHP group walking across the South side of Walton Hall toward Hullabaloo Hall. She advised that the group slowed down near the picnic tables at Walton Hall. She advised that she believed that her students were conversing with several individuals at the picnic tables. She advised that she heard someone yell a racial slur. advised that she heard a female voice say "nigger". She also said she heard someone say the phrase "Go back to where you came from". also advised that she heard "Go to bonfire". was unable to describe to me who had said any of the comments. believed that the individuals involved were still in or around the picnic table area. The students of UHP began to continue on their walking tour of Texas A&M University Campus. Officer Saffold remained with while I walked toward the picnic tables of Walton Hall to observe any interaction between TAMU students and UHP students. No interaction was observed at that time.

I did contact the small (approximately 13) group of individuals at the picnic tables. The group advised that they did talk to the UHP students and provided them with directions. They advised that they hadn't said any Walton Hall "chants". I identified the only female in the group as by her name and DOB (DL #). advised that there was music being played and multiple other conversations going on within both groups as she talked to some of the UHP students. She advised that she did not use a racial slur in any way. She said she did not hear any racial slurs being used by people in or near her group. No further information to report at this time.

On 2-10-2016 at approximately 1040 hours, I contacted again to inquire if the rest of the tour was without incident. I was unable to talk to her and left a message with her at that time.

I made contact with and she immediately started speaking loudly and in an excited voice that Fox News was broadcasting her interaction with the two women on their television show. She went on to state that she was being slandered and wanted me to do something about it. I asked her if she heard her name being used on the TV and she stated no, not her name but they were saying that she and described her. I advised her that if they didn't broadcast her name then they did not slander her and that they were probably just relaying what was told to them by some other party. She claimed that the facts were distorted and not what really happened. I advised her she may want to contact Student Counsel for advice on both issues but that at this time I could not do anything about the media broadcasting the story. She told me that she needed to talk to her mom on the other phone but that she knew she was going to try and make her and she did not want to give them up. I advised her that was a personal issue between them.



I was walking alongside one of my classmates and behind a classmate that was wearing a UT backpack. We were halfway passing the picnic table and I heard the comment, "go back to where you came from" by one of the Texas A&M students. It took me a moment to realize what had just been said. I replied, "You know we're black, right?" trying to give them the acknowledgement that they should change their word choice. After that, we continued to walk past and I looked to see if the chaperones heard what I said but they were talking amongst themselves and looked very concerned. I turned around and continued walking with the rest of the Junior class.

At approximately 5:00pm on Tuesday, February 9, 2016, was contacted by follow up with Resident regarding an incident she was involved in earlier that day. CD went to Resident room in , but nobody was present. At approximately 6:00pm, CD went back to Resident room to see if she was there. Resident introduced herself as opened the door, and stated "okay, I know the community director of . After the introduction, Resident why you're here and I'm really stressed out about this because that's not what happened at all" so asked her to explain what happened earlier in the day outside of Walton Hall involving a tour explained that she was hanging out with some of the guys outside of Walton Hall group. Resident explained that they all greeted the tour group with "howdy" and asked how their day was going but nothing else was exchanged between them and the tour group. At approximately 4pm on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 Director received a text message and then phone call, immediately after, from Associate Director of Residence Education, Christine Thoorsell regarding an incident in which one of her residents, was allegedly involved. These students stated to CD : and GHD that a tour group walked by the tables (between Walton Hall and Parking Lot 32) and asked where the 24-hour Desk/Hullabaloo desk is at. At this time, a tour guide had come in from behind and led them over to Hullabaloo Hall.

During the time the tour group came and left, Resident
Student Student and Student mentioned
about 15-20 residents/students were around the Walton Hall tables. It
was between classes so these 15-20 people came to the Walton Hall
tables, interacted with each other and left as those with classes got
there on time.

Resident stated that one of the prospective students had a
University of Texas-Austin backpack on. Resident mentioned this
backpack to Student but did so after the tour group had passed
by the tables and not within hearing range. According to Resident

, nothing was yelled or said loudly that could have been
misconstrued by the tour group.

Student stated a cop came by a few minutes later asking if anyone knew what happened.

Throughout the duration of everything happening, there was music playing but nothing that would have had derogatory words – according to the students that spoke to CD and GHD.

Arrival:

We arrived at Texas A&M University at College Station at approximately 2:00pm on Tuesday, February 9, 2016. As we walked toward the student center, we were approached by an Appelt Aggieland Visitor Center staff member who greeted us and stated that we would have to facilitate our own tour because they were understaffed. We were provided with campus maps and visitor badges. We were also directed to our first stop: Hullabaloo Dormitory.

On the way toward the dorm, two female Hampton Scholars standing toward the back of the line were approached by a Caucasian female student who befriended them and asked them where they were from. She then asked the students to . The students saw that they were of the and immediately walked away. They approached their chaperones and reported the incident immediately.

Verbal Exchange:

Directly following that incident, a large group of Hampton scholars passed Walton Hall where a group of approximately 13 students were sitting. One of the students yelled "Go back to where you came from and "be sure to check out Bonfire.com!" At that point one of our scholars turned around and yelled "You do know that we're black, right?" A chaperone heard the incident and asked her to keep going. Her friend also grabbed her arm and forced her to continue walking toward the dorm.

The same chaperone heard the only female in the group yelling the n* word multiple times as the scholars passed. She approached the other counselors to check out the incident. The counselors decided to call the campus police. They approached an A&M male student walking to his dorm where they asked him for the name of the Hall where the incident occurred. He said that they were in front of Walton Hall. They reached out to a passing female cadet who gave them the number to campus police.

Dispatch Call:

A female dispatcher took the call and when the counselor explained the situation, the dispatcher responded that the students "weren't doing anything illegal" The chaperone asked her "Are you saying what they did was legal or illegal?" After questioning the dispatcher for clarification out of shock by the response, the dispatcher confirmed that what they were doing was in fact legal by freedom of speech. She did not condone it but that she would still dispatch officers. At that point the call ended. The counselors proceeded to Hullaballoo Dorm where they spoke with the tour guide and called Campus Police. The counselor received a call from Officer Rogers and Saffold requesting their location because he was on his way. They were extremely professional and delicate when handling the situation. Once they took the report they proceeded to address the A&M students who had the verbal exchange. They followed up with the counselor making two phone calls.

Resident Assistance

The tour guide also tried to rectify the issue by stating that he lived in Walton dorm and that he was going to report it to the RA's.

As I walked into Hullabaloo Hall, a group of about 5 counselors from the black school/tour approached me asking if I myself had dealt with any racism at Texas A&M, of course I said no. I asked her what made her ask me that question, and the black lady with short hair said while there tour passed by walton dorm that someone yelled saying "Go back were you came from, Niggers aren't allowed here." I was then shocked and told her Texas A&M isn't the type of place to deal such low stupidity. I then told her about my success here so far as a black student along with how im good friends with guys in Walton. However, the group of counselors were still upset then called the police. I had then grabbed the tour guide to talk to them. He communicated with them then the police showed up.

That's everything that happened from my standpoint of view. I didn't hear anyone yell any crazy remarks. I didn't see or could of known who may have said that remark. The group was very respectful and calm when they talked to me.



- -15 to 20 residents/students were at the tables at the time the alleged incident occurred
- -One student in the tour group had on a University of Texas backpack. Resident mentioned the backpack to non-resident but did so after the tour group had passed by the tables. According to the students we spoke with nothing was yelled or said loudly that could have been misconstrued by the tour group.
- -A cop came by the tables a few minutes later asking if the students at the tables knew what happened
- -Music was playing, but nothing that would have had derogatory words (according to the students we spoke with)

On the way toward the dorm, two female Hampton Scholars standing toward the back of the line were approached by a Caucasian female student who befriended them and asked them where they were from. She then asked the students to

The students saw that they were of the and immediately walked away. They approached their chaperones and reported the incident immediately.

Verbal Exchange:

Directly following that incident, a large group of Hampton scholars passed Walton Hall where a group of approximately 13 students were sitting. One of the students yelled "Go back to where you came from and "be sure to check out Bonfire.com!" At that point one of our scholars turned around and yelled "You do know that we're black, right?" A chaperone heard the incident and asked her to keep going. Her friend also grabbed her arm and forced her to continue walking toward the dorm.

The same chaperone heard the only female in the group yelling the n* word multiple times as the scholars passed. She approached the other counselors to check out the incident. The counselors decided to call the campus police. They approached an A&M male student walking to his dorm where they asked him for the name of the Hall where the incident occurred. He said that they were in front of Walton Hall. They reached out to a passing female cadet who gave them the number to campus police.

Dispatch Call:

A female dispatcher took the call and when the counselor explained the situation, the dispatcher responded that the students "weren't doing anything illegal" The chaperone asked her "Are you saying what they did was legal or illegal?" After questioning the dispatcher for clarification out of shock by the response, the dispatcher confirmed that what they were doing was in fact legal by freedom of speech. She did not condone it but that she would still dispatch officers. At that point the call ended. The counselors proceeded to Hullaballoo Dorm where they spoke with the tour guide and called Campus Police. The counselor received a call from Officer Rogers and Saffold requesting their location because he was on his way. They were extremely professional and delicate when handling the situation. Once they took the report they proceeded to address the A&M students who had the verbal exchange. They followed up with the counselor making two phone calls.

Resident Assistance

The tour guide also tried to rectify the issue by stating that he lived in Walton dorm and that he was going to report it to the RA's.

Student stated a cop came by a few minutes later asking if anyone knew what happened.


Throughout the duration of everything happening, there was music playing but nothing that would have had derogatory words – according to the students that spoke to CD and GHD .
