Background: In 2007, Texas voters approved an amendment to the Texas Constitution establishing CPRIT and providing the state with the authority to issue \$3 billion in general obligation bonds over 10 years. Bond proceeds are to be distributed as funding awards for the express purpose of expediting innovation in cancer research and lowering the incidence of cancer in Texas. The Institute’s governing body, the Oversight Committee, is vested with the responsibility to award CPRIT funds for a wide variety of projects relevant to cancer research and prevention. CPRIT encourages applications that apply or develop state-of-the-art technologies, tools, and/or resources for cancer research and prevention programs, including proposals with potential commercialization opportunities.¹

Issue: There is widespread support to increase the number of “Tier One” research institutions in Texas, which often cannot be achieved without additional research funding.

One concept that has been suggested is to achieve the goal of increased funding for universities by requiring all Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) grant applicants to be to be associated with institutions of higher education.

Bottom Line Analysis: The majority of research grants (95.9%) are already being distributed to Texas’ public and private universities. Please note that CPRIT also distributes grants for prevention programs and product development, neither of which would drive research expenditures, though the Advisory Board could revise the distribution thresholds between research and commercial product development grants. Therefore, of the \$763.9 million in **research** dollars distributed by CPRIT, 74.3% or \$567.5 million went to public universities and 21.6% or \$165.6 million went two private Texas universities -- Baylor and Rice. Four other research grants went to non-academic institutions: Scott and White (\$3.7 million), Methodist Hospital Research Institute (\$26.2 million), Gradalis Inc. (\$806 thousand), and Texas Life Science Foundation (\$8 thousand).

Current statute

allows for research awards, including recruitment grants, to be given to private universities.

under Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 102, CPRIT maintains a Texas University Advisory Committee to advise the oversight committee and other divisions regarding the role of institutions of higher education in cancer research. This committee includes two private institutions, and is composed of the following members:

- (1) two members appointed by the chancellor of The University of Texas System to represent:
 - (A) The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center;
 - (B) The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston;
 - (C) The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston;
 - (D) The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio;
 - (E) The University of Texas Health Center at Tyler; or
 - (F) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center;
- (2) one member appointed by the chancellor of The Texas A&M University System to represent:
 - (A) The Texas A&M University System Health Science Center; or
 - (B) the teaching hospital for The Texas A&M Health Science Center College of Medicine;
- (3) one member appointed by the chancellor of the Texas Tech University System to represent the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center;
- (4) one member appointed by the chancellor of the University of Houston System to represent the system;
- (5) one member appointed by the chancellor of the Texas State University System to represent the system;
- (6) one member appointed by the chancellor of the University of North Texas System to represent the system;
- (7) one member appointed by the president of Baylor College of Medicine;**
- (8) one member appointed by the president of Rice University; and**
- (9) members appointed at the executive director's discretion by the chancellors of other institutions.

Grant Funding History

CPRIT has funded 817 awards for cancer research, product development, and prevention since 2010. The total amount awarded thus far is \$1,149,249,373. 95.9% of research dollars distributed by CPRIT went to Texas' institutions of higher education.

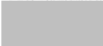
