



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Now that Greg Abbott has published his "here's how to fix America" book, is a presidential run in 2020 a foregone conclusion?

- "That depends entirely on 2016... and if Cruz wins the nomination and loses narrowly in November, he will probably try again in 2020. If he loses by a healthy margin, he may try again but won't gain traction."
- "If Hillary wins, yes."
