


INSIDE INTELLIGENCE

If the "Brexit" deals a blow to the Texas economy, where would it be felt?

- "Our 'direct' economic exchange with Great Britain is not significant enough to greatly affect our economy. Where our exchanges with them intersect with the U.S. economy is where it might be felt."
- "Brexit's effect on Texas will be minimal or less."

- "Oil is still the big thing, but Brexit should have no lasting effect on oil. It's a global market that responds to supply and demand, and Britain's status in the EU is just not a major factor in those forces."

- "A lower Pound and Euro vs. the dollar will make competitive exports from the UK and Europe cheaper."
- "In the short term it will have some impact, but people that buy, trade, will figure it out."
- "Another reason to vote against Trump."

Does the "Brexit" vote foreshadow a Trump victory in the U.S. in November?

- "Sadly, the Brits are already seeing the foolishness of their decision! This does NOT help Trump in any way."
- "While there are parallels of a strong discontent with political elites, Trump seems incapable of capitalizing on this. His greatest opponent in this race is his own mouth."
- "Never underestimate the anger of the voter."
- "The irony is that the people who tend to love Trump are those who make fun

- of Europeans. How funny that they think the Brits have provided such a strong example."
- "No. Brexit was, in essence, a singleissue election (a referendum) that boiled down to immigration. The U.S. presidential election is typically not a single issue (unless it's the economy, stupid)."
- "The Brexit vote is awakening those voters that have been lollygagging this election cycle. It has also forced those

voters that are voting for Trump for the hell of it to reconsider."

- "Trump is 'reverse Darwinism.'"
- "About as much as Groundhog Day."
- "What part of HELL YES do you not understand? Can you say P-R-E-S-I-D-E-N-T TRUMP? GET USED TO IT. ELITES ARE GETTING IT HANDED TO THEM."

Unless/until he's changing the actual math for November turnout, then there will be no Trump victory to foreshadow."
