## Was the choice by Trump to travel to reliably red states like Texas and Mississippi this week a good gambit?

• "He left Texas with more money, more votes, and more press than Hillary had this week."

- "All media is good media. And he needed the boost of confidence that is bestowed to him in those regions."
- "The national media will follow him wherever he goes."
- "Three million dollars"
- "Risky as it attracts criticism and sheds continued media light on his campaign's problems."
- "Why spend time in states he's likely to win?"

• "Classic 'preaching to the choir.' No upside for him when he's already got the people he's speaking to." • "Ground game is important, but the candidate's appearances are national. As long as one is having a fundraiser, why not go meet the troops? The concept of a candidate limiting his or her travels to 'battleground' states, at least in August or September of an election year, seems outmoded to me."

• "Doesn't matter where he is — he will be covered."

• "He has no chance — except in racist places like Mississippi and Texas."

• "Smart to pick up as much cash as possible in friendly states, assuming he plans to be in the swing states in the fall."

• "If you're already here for fundraising, why not stay for the press? Who cares if the event is in Texas or Mississippi? Coverage will be national. Of course, that only helps him if he doesn't say anything stupid, which is highly unlikely."

• "I think his only hope is to motivate and turn out people who usually don't vote."

## A recent survey by Public Policy Polling puts Trump's lead in Texas at 6 points. Where would you put it?

• "If Trump can't win Texas, the GOP is in for its worst defeat in the modern era. And this is to the biggest liar the Democrats have nominated in my lifetime."

• "Did you see the crowd at the rally in Austin? No one knew there were that many Republican voters in Travis County!"

• "I believe there is a large percentage of voters that want Trump on that wall, that need Trump on that wall, but refuse to admit in public they are voting for him."

• "Trump's margin over Clinton in Texas is less than six points right now, but it seems reasonable to assume that the margin will increase a bit before voting begins. However, that assumes that Trump doesn't do too many more phenomenally stupid things, so I'm not giving odds."

• "Even the Ds know that that poll was an anomaly, so I figure he is, at the very least, 10-12 points ahead."

• "I wish Trump wouldn't get as many Republican votes, but he will. It's Texas after all." • "Unconventional strategy for an unconventional candidate."

• "Waste of money and time. Then again, he can't win, so what's the loss?"

- "Liberals don't trust Hillary."
- "Even Republicans don't like him."

Those who answer 10-12 points or more than 12 points should have to sit in Time Out."

• "At the end of the day, a large number of poll respondents who claim today that they are not voting for Trump will end up voting for him only because Hillary really is 'that bad.'"

• "At 6 points."

• "That's about right. And it's comically low for a GOP candidate."

• "Lots of Rs stay home, or skip the first choice on the ballot."

• "He'll win Texas, but the Libertarian candidate is likely to get significant support."
