


The Texas Weekly/Texas Tribune insider poll for the week of 28 April 2017

Very likely




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

As things stand now, what are the odds a deal is struck this week to prevent a government shutdown?

- "We're in *his* world now, the Art of the Negotiator! Lawd help us!"
- "Ds can use the leverage for concessions on other things."
- "I think a true repeal of Obamacare is the sticking point. Is it important enough to break a campaign promise? Important enough to shut down the government?"
- "The deal is already done."

- "Who cares? I'm not paid to follow D.C. BS but to pass my clients' bills here in Austin in the next 30 days."
- "Federal government? Never heard of it."
- "They have tricks to play to keep it open several more weeks, just like last time."
- "It will likely involve a continuing resolution and a delay in the showdown."

Who gets blamed if there's a limited federal government shutdown at week's end?

- "The Trump spin machine will find a way to blame the Dems."
- "Depends upon who's doing the blaming ... but Congressional Republicans seem to be filling the scapegoat role rather handily as of late."
- "GOP always get the blame. Schumer and his media allies will ensure the GOP gets raked over the coals if the federal government is shut down."
- "Everyone will get the blame!!"
- "Regardless of the facts, Republicans always get blamed."
- "They are like watching a Keystone Kops movie."
- "The majority party will be blamed."
- "The deal was set until he threw in The Wall."
- "The sad thing is Dems cause this to happen and it is always the Rs who get blamed. They just can't play the PR/messaging game."
- "All of the above."
- "'Blamed' by whom. Silly question. The question tells more (about the questioner) than the response ever could (about the audience)."

- "Dems do not want to fund the President's wall. He was elected to build the wall. Of course, he will make it virtual in some remote areas."
- "But as always, they will try to pin it on the Democrats."
- "Trump should be able even with media against him and spinning frantically the other way to blame a shutdown on the Dems. Senate will be debating a bill with at least some wall funding. If Dems filibuster, and refuse to consider it, the finger will be pointed at the Dems. 'We prefer a government shutdown to a bit of wall funding' is not a good argument for the Dems."
- "Trump by the media. Congressional Democrats for a majority of voters. Don't think it helps Rs for Trump to make an issue of the wall."
- "That depends on who is doing the blaming. The media, having become predictably one-dimensional and nakedly partisan, will blame Trump. Not everyone will buy their version of events."

• "It's a circular firing squad. Dems will blame Trump and GOP. GOP will blame Dems. Trump will probably blame both of them in some form or fashion. Business as usual in a Trump D.C."

What happens to Trump's demand for border wall funding in a government-spending bill this week?

- "They will argue that no funds would be expended at this time anyway."
- "Democrats have voted to fund the wall in the past. Why won't they this time? Because Trump is President. And if Hillary were President, Republicans would find reason to oppose anything she wanted to do."
- "But funds won't be spent ... too many existing roadblocks."
- "Unless the Congressmen are tone deaf, they know that this is a priority for most Americans."
- "That ridiculous wall will not happen. Now if he were willing to build it on the

Texas side of the RED River, different outcome altogether."

- "Wall may not be funded directly, but there will likely be funds that can be used for wall construction."
- "No need to fund it because Mexico is going to pay for it! Remember he promised"
- "Let's be honest, along with not funding it, I'm honestly hoping to get to hear Congressman Vela tell the President where he can put the wall again."

Some speculate that Texas lawmakers won't complete their budget in the regular session. Do you think there is any risk that Texas could go to the wire, as the feds are doing, on government spending?

- "The budget will be finished how to spend the money and where. What will get held up is the funding sources that will go to the wire."
- "Lt. Gov. wants one."
- "It'll be Patrick's fault if the Lege goes into a special session on SB 1. We all know what he likes to do and that's to hold things hostage until his tantrum results in what he wants."
- "'Any' risk? Sure. Significant risk? Unlikely."
- "Isn't this issue recycled every two years? And yet, what happens? When was the last time a Texas Legislature did not pass a budget before Sine Die? Yeah, I don't remember either."
- "Yes, they will go to the wire. No they won't fail to pass the budget. They don't want to spend the summer in Austin."

- "Who wants to spend state money we don't have on a special session? This makes no sense to me."
- "Protecting the ESF is worthy of going to the wire."
- "Our process is a joke. We can't get committees earlier? Bring back Bullock! And we jack around the first two-andhalf months or so. Please, people, make the hard choices and grow up!"
- "Since the House has given Patrick no victories on other matters, I suspect Patrick will hang super tough on the budget. He'll have the upper hand on it because he doesn't mind having a special. Then the House will have to make a decision on a budget much closer to the Senate's."
- "We are at risk anytime the Legislature is in session."
- "Always a risk. But it will get done."
- "There will be a special session in which the Lt. Gov. gives \$1.5 billion to

fund one-time needs like CPS and road improvements from the Rainy Day Fund. Education will get another \$1 billion from the general fund for the biennium and in return the Speaker will give the Senate some school choice for special needs and families at or below the poverty line in urban areas. Rural areas will be exempted."

- "The call of a carefree summer will push them to finish..."
- "Straus wins. Too risky for the Republicans to go beyond the regular session. Patrick goes on to say his program was hijacked and feeds red meat to his base."
- "They always go to the wire. But, they also always get it done."
- "We will get a budget."
- "But no special session, and they get the Legislature completes its work before Sine Die."
