Without taking the variance of the weights into account, the margin of error for the full sample is $2.83 \%$. To compensate for the additional uncertainty from weighting, we apply a multiplier derived from the coefficient of variation of the weights: $\operatorname{sqrt}\left(1+\mathrm{CV}^{\wedge} 2\right)$, where $\mathrm{CV}=\mathrm{sd}$ (weights)/mean(weights). For this weight sensitive calculation, the MOE for the full sample is $3.28 \%$.
