Warren For President Announces New Texas Endorsements

As campaign continues ramping up organization on the ground, local officials announce their support for Warren

San Antonio, TX – Today, the Warren for President campaign announced a series of new endorsements from local Texas officials, including city council members, state representatives, county commissioners, activists and advocates across Houston, Austin and San Antonio. The endorsements come on the heels of Warren’s office openings in San Antonio and Austin last December, which brought together hundreds of supporters to show them all the ways they can get involved. On Monday, Warren was also [endorsed](#) by **former Secretary of Housing and Urban Development Julián Castro**.

The campaign has [announced](#) its Texas State Director Jenn Longoria and already has over two dozen senior staffers and organizers across the state. Texas for Warren has had staff on the ground since the summer. In addition to the officials announced today, Warren was previously endorsed by **Texas State Representative Erin Zwiener (District 45)**, who spoke at Texas for Warren’s Austin office opening and **Texas State Representative Shawn Thierry (District 146)**, who introduced Warren at her July town hall at her alma mater, the University of Houston.
