

Texas Weekly Index: House

The TWI is the difference between the average vote for statewide Republicans and the average for statewide Democrats in each district over the last two election cycles. If it's red (in parentheses), it's a Republican district. If it's blue, it's Democratic territory. Example: in Smithee's HD-86, statewide Republicans beat statewide Democrats by an average of 57.5 percentage points in the 2006 and 2008 general elections.
